Password Security

The <u>National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC)</u> is urging people to use **3 random words as a passwords after** they published an analysis of the 100,000 most <u>commonly re-occurring</u> passwords that have been accessed by third parties in global cyber breaches.

The most popular passwords include:

1) 123456 (23.2m accounts) 2) 123456789 (7.7m accounts) 3) querty (3.8m accounts)

Visit the <u>Have I Been Pwned</u> website to check if you have an account that has been compromised in a data breach.



Beach Hut Security

The weather is getting warmer and people will be using beach huts a lot more as we move into summer. Protect your hut with these top tips:

- ✓ Fix strong solid shutters over glazed areas. These should be securely fixed and locked in place.
- ✓ Fix a solid steel security bar across the door. This should
 be bolted through the door and reinforced at the back
 (inside the hut) with a steel plate with matching aligned
 holes and use concealed screws or coach bolts.
- ✓ Use good quality closed shackle padlocks which should be at least 6cm/2.5 inches wide, and use coach bolts instead of cross head screws for fixing.

Any additional locks on the door should be positioned a third of the way down the door.

Snapchat is a popular photo sharing app that lets users share their photos for a few seconds before they 'disappear'. But anyone receiving a pic can keep it by taking a screen shot. The site is criticised for making it easy for children to be stalked or groomed.



On Ask.fm anonymous users ask other users questions. They can easily hide their identity and say what they like without any consequences. Bullying and abuse on the site has allegedly led to very traumatic experiences amongst youngsters.
