Adult social care savings proposals

On 16 June, Hampshire County Council's Executive Member for Adult Services and Public Health, Councillor Liz Fairhurst, will consider recommendations to save £680,000 from the County Council's Adult Social Care budget to help meet the Local Authority's overall budget shortfall of at least £80million by April 2023

The recommended savings comprise:-

£320,000 by ending the following grants:; 1) the Neighbourhood Care and Support grant scheme, 2) the Community Based Support grant scheme, 3) the Rural Connections grant scheme.

These are provided to voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations across Hampshire to support adults to continue to live independently in their communities. The County Council would continue to actively work with the current grant holders to explore ways that their services could be sustained after the current grant award has ceased. A further saving of £360,000 is also recommended by reducing funding for commissioned non-statutory services.

Consultation opens on proposed changes to County Council financial support for transport and travel

Hampshire County Council is seeking views on proposed changes to supported passenger transport services (local bus and community transport services funded by the County Council) and the County Council funded enhancements to the Concessionary Travel scheme in Hampshire

The proposals are made in the light of continued significant pressures on local authority budgets, following year on year substantial reductions in central Government funding, and increasing costs and demand for services such as social care.

People have until midnight on 24 July 2022 to have their say on the proposals – changes which could achieve potential savings of £800,000.
